## Helen C. Fenske Visitor Center



**The Refuge is open daily from sunrise to sunset.**

Help maintain this natural oasis:

- Public access is restricted to designated trails (except within the Wilderness Area east of Long Hill Road.)
- Pets must be leashed and are allowed ONLY on Pleasant Plains Road and on the turf lawn at the Visitor Center. Service animals are always welcome.
- Bicycles are allowed only on Pleasant Plains Road and in parking areas.




## Wilderness Area Trails

To help preserve the refuge, protect wildlife and ensure a quality visit for yourself and others, the following are prohibited:

- Collecting plants, animals or parts thereof (dead or alive)
- Releasing any animals or dumping any plant material
- Littering
- Fishing
- Hunting (except by special refuge permit)
- Use of drones

A full account of refuge regulations may be found in Title 50 Code of Federal Regulations, sections 25-32.



## Wildlife Observation Center

220 Long Hill Rd, Harding Township, NJ 07976

GPS: 40 42' 47" N, 74 29' 4" W

Trails at the Wildlife Observation Center and the White Oak Trail are a mix of wood/trex boardwalk and compacted stone dust; a majority of these trails are flat with limited inclines. The Bockoven and Nature Detective Trails are flat with limited inclines and consist of compacted stone dust, wood chip, and unimproved natural surfaces.
